“Doing the Right Thing” — Tom Delnoce

This class explores the ethical and moral breakdown that is assaulting culture from all sides. Through panel discussions, interviews, and student questions, this video study, hosted by Brit Hume, raises ethical issues in a compelling and fresh way, stimulating thought, discussion and action. This 6-part study encourages participants to examine themselves and explore how ethical and character issues relate to their lives at home, school and the workplace.

Sessions include: ▶ How did we get into this mess? ▶ Is there truth—a moral law we can all know? ▶ If we know what is right, can we do it? ▶ What does it mean to be human? ▶ Ethics in the market place and in public life...

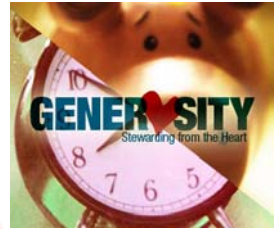
“Discovering the Power of Generosity” — Sharon Moore

Did you know there are over 2,350 verses in the Bible about money? Did you know that nearly half of Jesus’ parables are about possessions? The Bible is packed with wise counsel about your financial life. In fact, Jesus had more to say about money than about heaven and hell combined. Co-developed with Purpose Driven Ministries and Pastor Rick Warren, this 7-week, video-based, small group study is a great option for studying biblical financial management in a small group setting. Topics discussed include debt, saving, planning, and giving—*no personal financial information is shared*. Cost for Materials: \$17 per workbook

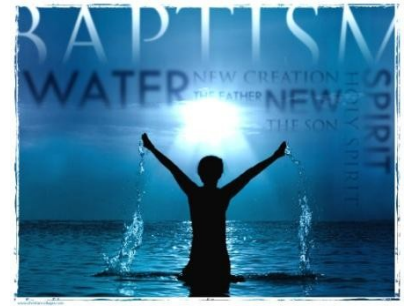
SUNDAY CLASSES (CONTINUED)

“Baptism Preparation — for Students Grades 4-8” — *Pastor Jason Doughty*

Baptism is commonly referred to as an outward symbol of an inner reality. Baptism involves the public proclamation and identification with Christ, and His body, the Church. This class will explore three main questions: 1) What does it mean to be a Christian and how do we know we are one? 2) How did we come to practice baptism? 3) What is the meaning of baptism? The parent’s understanding of baptism and of their child’s spiritual life is vital in determining a child’s readiness for this ceremony. Because of this, one parent is required to attend with their child. If this is not possible, arrangements should be made for another adult to fill this important role.

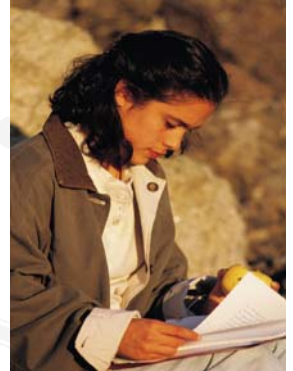
“Precept Study of Hebrews”—Part II (Chapters 5-13) — *Nancy Whalen and Karen Kelly* *‘Draw Near to His Throne’, by Kay Arthur* (for Women only)

Ever wonder how the New Testament connects to the Old? This fascinating study of Hebrews 5-13 explains relationships between the two covenants, the earthly and heavenly tabernacles, and the sacrifices of animals and the Son of Man. See how Jesus fulfilled the Law and the Prophets and became our great High Priest. Class includes five hours/week of homework, along with weekly discussions and a video teaching. Please pick up books in the church office and have Lesson 1 prepared for first class on January 10th. This 19-week study is a continuation of a class that started in the fall, however, you do not need to have attended Part I to join us in Part II. *Cost of workbooks is \$25 and can be waived.* If you are new to Precept Inductive Bible Studies, a short training class is available and encouraged (www.precept.org).

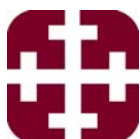


WEDNESDAY CLASSES
